1. COURSE DESCRIPTION

1.1. Course objectives

This course provides a broad picture and understanding of modern and historical Britain, its institutions and its peoples, as background for the study of language and literature, and translation. It locates key issues in British experience in their contemporary and historical contexts, while also examining the spread of selected features of British culture its influence on the world.

1.2. Course enrolment requirements and entry competences required for the course

1.3. Expected course learning outcomes

At the conclusion of the course, students will have acquired a knowledge of key aspects of British experience, and will have learnt about both the historical roots of these features of British culture and the diverse ways in which they have come to be understood in contemporary Britain and elsewhere.
