1. COURSE DESCRIPTION
<b>1.1. Course objectives</b>
The objective of this course is to develop and improve students' oral and written communication in English through acquisition of new vocabulary and analysis of syntactic structures.

<b>1.3. Expected course learning outcomes</b>
Upon successful completion of the course the students will: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Be able to use syntactic structures appropriately;</li><li>- Expand their vocabulary;</li><li>- Improve their knowledge of collocations;</li><li>- Improve their communication skills;</li><li>- Be able to analyse certain aspects of British and American culture.</li></ul>
<b>1.4. Course content</b>
The course encompasses the study, analysis and practice of syntactic structures of the English language, and work on short stories and texts of various content. Special emphasis is placed on lexico-grammatical and cultural aspects of the chosen texts. Also, knowledge acquired in courses English Language 1 and English Language 2 is further practiced and expanded upon. The main topics are: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>1 the simple sentence – basics; in detail – subject-verb agreement and negation</li><li>2 sentence types and discourse functions</li><li>3 pro-forms and ellipsis</li><li>4 coordination – coordination and subordination of clauses, coordinators, correlatives, simple coordination, complex coordination</li></ul>
