### 1. COURSE DESCRIPTION

#### 1.1. Course objectives

This course aims to provide an in-depth overview of important grammatical structures of the German language. By systematically reviewing and consolidating the subject matter, participants will close any potential gaps in their grammar knowledge and build strong theoretical foundations for future study. This course will also help participants become more competent and confident language users. They will gain a thorough knowledge of important grammatical terminology throughout the course, enabling them to not only to talk about German grammar but to also facilitate autonomous self-study in the future.

#### 1.2. Course enrolment requirements and entry competences required for the course

#### 1.3. Expected course learning outcomes

By the end of this course, you should be able to: use the basic terminology used to describe the grammar of German and develop a sound understanding of German morphology, i.e. the main grammatical features of different word classes (nouns, verbs, adjectives, prepositions etc.) develop an understanding of German syntax, i.e. how words and phrases are used to form sentences (main clauses, coordinate clauses and subordinate clauses) use skills to apply the theoretical grammar knowledge into practice.

#### 1.4. Course content

Morphology - Verbs: tenses (present, perfect, imperfect, past perfect, future), special verbs (separable, inseparable, reflexive, modals), mood (imperative, subjunctive II), passive voice, verbs taking indirect objects, verbs taking indirect + direct objects, verbs taking prepositional objects. Pronouns: personal (nominative, accusative, dative), reflexive, indefinite, interrogative, relative
