1. COURSE DESCRIPTION
1.1. Course objectives
<p>An overview of art history in Europe and Croatia in the pre-Romanesque and Romanesque period (11th-13th century).</p> <p>Acquiring the knowledge of basic stylistic and iconographic characteristics of the aforementioned periods. Identifying the factors that influenced the emergence of stylistic and regional groups within a certain historical framework.</p> <p>Identifying and analysing monuments and monumental entities, and comprehending the development of art language, as well as art language continuity and changes.</p> <p>The interpretation of selected monuments and monumental entities that are characteristic of particular geographic zones.</p>

<p>Students will gain the knowledge of historical events that occurred in Europe and Croatia in the period between the 11th and 13th centuries, since these events are directly related to the emergence and development of the art of that period.</p> <p>Identifying and evaluating the most significant monuments of that period.</p> <p>Identifying basic stylistic features and developing the ability to carry out a formal analysis</p> <p>Identifying basic contents and iconographic themes, as well as the norms and forms of representation in all the media.</p> <p>The ability to form value judgments, participate in discussions and carry out a comparative analysis of certain monuments.</p>

First appearances of Romanesque and further development of the style in architecture, sculpture and painting; political, historical and social circumstances related to formation of the style; formal characteristics and regional differences in Romanesque art across Europe.
