Students are provided with historical insights into European art development in the period between 3rd and 11th century. The course content is divided into two categories: Late Antiquity art and Early Medieval art. Throughout the course, art development is observed within the framework of historical events and changes. Students will acquire terms and basic elements that are characteristic of the language of form and iconography.
