1. COURSE DESCRIPTION

1.1. Course objectives

The aim of the course is to develop students' competence in reading, understanding and analyzing administrative/business texts and texts relating to economy and law, which are written in Italian. Students will deal with different types of economic texts (ranging from articles appearing in daily newspapers and providing an economic commentary to academic texts and concrete documents relating to business environment), communication texts, administrative acts, and normative texts.
